It covers key safety requirements and responsibilities, emphasises the importance of following safety protocols, and highlights the potential consequences of non-compliance.

Upon successful completion, participants will receive a Statement of Attainment for the unit of competency *FBPWHS3001 Contribute to work health and safety processes*.

- Learn about safety programs and their significance.
- Familiarise with Health and Safety regulations.
- Understand risk assessments.
- Identify and mitigate key dangers in a distillery and brewery environment.

- Discover resources for accessing relevant legislation.
- Knowing the risks involved in distillation.
- How to read a Safety Data Sheet (SDS)
